## **The MAH program is designed for**

- High school teachers who want to advance their careers with a Master's degree
- Future teachers of English and Philosophy
- Graduate students who will later pursue a terminal degree in fields such as law, Education, philosophy, English, and creative writing
- Graduate students who wish to teach English or Philosophy at the college level
- Graduate students who wish to build their own degree

## **Hallmarks of the MAH degree:**

- Finish with 36 hours in as little as 2 years, or at your own pace within 5 years
- Core curriculum courses in each discipline
- Students studying English may choose Literary Studies or Creative Writing
- Electives in each discipline
- Team-taught, interdisciplinary courses
- Build your own interdisciplinary degree (*other Humanities concentrations added depending on student interest*)
- Write a Master's-level thesis
- All courses are seminars or workshops
- Small class size – individual, personal attention from highly-qualified faculty
