Outcome One - Graduate Success on National Council Licensure Exam (NCLEX):

Each graduate must pass the NCLEX to be licensed as a Registered Nurse in the U.S. The annual pass rate will be at least 80% for all first-time test-takers during the period 1 January – 31 December.

Outcome Three- Graduates Obtaining a Job: One hundred percent of graduates will be employed within twelve months of graduation.




