*EDU 305 is a pre-requisite for EDU 410; EDU 410 is a pre-requisite for THE 441. All requirements must be completed or concurrent with enrolling in THE 441.

*Passing of PRAXIS I (Reading, Writing, and Mathematics), ACT score of 22 or higher, or SAT score of 1030 or higher is a requirement to take EDU 305

*Passing of a comprehensive theology exam is required to graduate from this program

*Students desiring certification prior to graduation must take EDU 421 - Student Teaching, a full-time, 5 days a week teaching obligation in an assigned classroom. Students desiring certification after graduation and have a full-time teaching position must register for EDU 461A and EDU 461B (Internship I and II) which require supervised evaluations.

*Prior to applying for a Louisiana teaching certificate, candidates must pass the Praxis II Principles of Learning and Teaching (PLT) exam for their grade level cluster

* To be certified, passing scores on Praxis II content area exam are required for your level of certification (Middle school Praxis exams do not qualify) and a completed application packet is required
