

To the right are the submissions we received. would like congratulate everyone who participated and invite more students in the future to participate as well. We truly are a diverse student body.


The middle row of the diversity-photo-square





Ottaway says it's an exciting time at UHC and she hopes to play a role in advancing more and more student activities, including the of formal athletic programs, "as we transition into a residential university."


